

Worship Attendance. Students must attend worship services regularly during their program of study. Attendance is required for all students in the MDiv program.

Final Exams. Students must pass all final exams in order to graduate. Exams are given at the end of each semester. Students who fail an exam may retake it the following semester.

Residency Requirements. Students must complete a certain number of credit hours at Andrews University in order to graduate.

Time Limits on Degrees. Students must complete their program of study within a certain number of years. Extensions may be granted in certain circumstances.

Transfer Credit. Students may receive credit for courses completed at other institutions. Credit is granted on a case-by-case basis.

PROGRAMS

M.A. in Christian Ministry. This program is designed for students who wish to pursue a career in ministry. It includes courses in biblical studies, theology, and practical ministry.

M.A. in Theology. This program is designed for students who wish to pursue a career in theological studies. It includes courses in biblical studies, church history, and systematic theology.

M.A. in Church History. This program is designed for students who wish to pursue a career in church history. It includes courses in church history, biblical studies, and theology.

M.A. in Biblical Studies. This program is designed for students who wish to pursue a career in biblical studies. It includes courses in biblical studies, church history, and theology.

M.A. in Christian Education. This program is designed for students who wish to pursue a career in Christian education. It includes courses in Christian education, biblical studies, and theology.

MDiv: Master of Divinity

The Master of Divinity (MDiv) program is a two-year program of study that prepares students for ministry. The program includes courses in biblical studies, theology, and practical ministry.

Students who complete the MDiv program will be prepared to serve in a variety of ministry settings, including churches, parachurch organizations, and seminaries.

The MDiv program is designed to provide students with a solid foundation in biblical studies, theology, and practical ministry. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in internships and other practical ministry experiences.
