

- x Find your class alphabetically on the list on “Syllabus” – far right of the listings. You will need to submit your username and password in order to receive a PDF copy of the syllabus. If one is not provided, email the professor of record. An automatic email can be sent by clicking on their name, which is also provided on the list of classes.
- x Syllabus will list books/textbooks required and class expectations.

When/how do I decide if I will do a thesis/project/or comprehensive exams?

Students decide which final capstone project they wish to complete. It is usually determined by your future goals. Students wanting to apply for future doctoral degrees are encouraged to do a thesis. However, if you are planning to go into a professional or ministry arena rather than an academic environment, you may want to choose a Research Project as your final capstone. Comprehensive Exams are usually selected by students who are not interested in pursuing degrees past the master level. Your Academic Advisor will have a conversation with you regarding your future plans and help you decide what is best. It is recommended that you select your final capstone project during the first semester in the program. This will help determine which classes you should take in the future.
